The man fails (Saul) – "hast rejected the wordLORD hath rejected thee from being king" 15:26
God's man anointed – "LORD looketh on the heart Samuelanointed him [David]" 16:7,13
God's man rejected (by Israel) – "Saul spaketo all his servantsthey should kill David" 19:1

David pardoned (not by law) - "LORD...put away thy sin...sure mercies of David" 12:13 / Isa. 55:3

David rejected – "hearts of the men of Israel...after Absalom" (to make him king over David) 15:13 David betrayed – "Ahithophel...I will smite the king...pleased...all the elders of Israel" 17:1-4 David received (when he returned) – "the king returned...the people...conducted the king" 19:15,40
